PROGRAMS OVERVIEW

In early 2024, Renew America Together sought out to create two signature curriculums that would align and further the mission of the organization. Over the course of several months, we engaged experts in the fields of communications and disinformation. Alongside the experts, we developed two new program curriculums: SERVE: a framework for civility, and TRUST combatting disinformation: a guide to save democracy. These trademark pending courses are now being offered to external partners and our Civility Leadership Institute.

SERVE: a framework for civility, is Renew America Together's signature communication curriculum. Developed with experts, this course was designed to not only be taught, but to have participants trained to teach back to their respective communities.

Throughout SERVE, participants will learn our framework for navigating complicated and difficult topics of discussion. The audience will walk away understanding the steps to take to have a civil conversation, and an invitation to further engage with SERVE through RATO offerings.

SERVE is an adaptable curriculum suited for any age or career status and we strive to seek out partnerships with diverse audiences.

TRUST combating disinformation: a guide to save democracy is Renew America Together's signature master class to teach citizens how to identify and combat disinformation online. This two-hour course engages participants through a series of activities, videos from a disinformation specialist, and conversations around the history of disinformation and the tools people need to know to identify it.

The TRUST curriculum is set up as a virtual or in-person master class. Participants are guided through a series of videos created by a disinformation specialist intertwined with real-time group activities, conversations, and games.

TRUST is broken into two parts. Part one covers the history and motivation behind disinformation. Part two covers active techniques and critical thinking skills to identify disinformation as it appears online. The goal of the course is for participants to feel confident using and teaching these skills with those in their communities. TRUST is an adaptable curriculum suited for most ages.

To date, Renew America Together has hosted **35+** Town Hall and Leadership Seminar events

Town Hall meetings are Renew America Together's original programming. The intention behind these events is to bring together voices from each side of the political spectrum to come together and have a live discussion on a topic while demonstrating civility.

LEADERSHIP SEMINARS

Leadership Seminars are versatile ways that Renew America Together can engage with a wide variety of audiences. Previous events have consisted of keynote addresses by General Clark followed by an invitation for participants to engage in civility projects or further programming with Renew America Together.










CIVILITY **LEADERSHIP** INSTITUTE

The Civility Leadership Institute consists of 30 leaders from around the country who are selected, through an application process, to participate in the year-long program. CLI participants are specifically

chosen based on their potential impact to help promote and spread civility throughout the country.

In its fourth year of operation, CLI has seen 150 participants representing 35 states. In 2023, Renew America Together successfully ran the flagship cohort with cohort 3, and a pilot expansion cohort through Hiram College. The fourth cohort of CLI kicked off in July of 2024 at the third annual Civility Summit in Little Rock, AR.








CLI Cohort 3, and Hiram Cohort are currently undergoing their full-year evaluations. The data on this page is representative of their mid-program findings.


KEY INDICATORS Cohort 3




